

BLUEBERRIES **PRICE \$7.00 each**

(1-gallon Rabbiteye varieties.)

PREMIER: Mid-season, large firm berries, very good flavor, and the berries store well. Bright green foliage makes it good for ornamental use.

TIFBLUE: Mid to late-season, large, firm berries, light blue in color and quite flavorful. Popular for its appearance and productivity, winter hardy.

POWDER BLUE: Mid-season, darker blue berries, sweet flavor, resistant to cracking.

BRIGHTWELL: Early season. Average fruit size. Very firm. Plants grow upright and open. Berries are light blue with excellent quality and flavor. Yields are high. Pollinate with Tifblue or Climax.

ONSLOW: Mid-late season. Vigorous, Semi-upright fruit. Self-pollinating.

BLACKBERRIES **PRICE \$7.00 each**

(All are thornless and upright; come in 1-gallon pots.)

ARAPAHO: Very large fruit, good flavor, average sugar content. Cold hardy, disease resistant well rooted. Excellent quality.

APACHE: Sweet, cone-shaped berry. Ripens late (mid-June). Cold hardy and high yielding.

NAVAHO: Medium size fruit, excellent flavor, ripens late (mid-June).

RASPBERRIES **PRICE \$7.00 each**

(Both are thorny and come in 1-gallon pots.)

HERITAGE: Upright and ever-bearing. Berries are large, firm and attractive. Disease resistant. Late season.

NANTAHALA: New release from NC State, upright variety with dark red berries that are longer and wider than Heritage. Seeds are small. Berries ripen later than Heritage extending the season and avoiding sun scald & heat damage.

BUNCH GRAPES **PRICE \$8.00 each**

(Potted in 1-gallon pots.)

CONCORD: Bluish-black color, medium size, large clusters good flavor. Vigorous and very productive. Ripens mid -to late-season. Great for fresh eating, juice, pies, and jellies.

NIAGARA: White, large tight colors. Good flavor. Ripens mid -to late-season (several days prior to Concord).

MUSCADINES **PRICE \$8.00 each**

(Potted in 1-gallon pots.)

NESBIT: Black, Self-fertile. Good Size, large clusters, edible skins, very productive, disease resistant. Mid -to late-season.

TRIUMPH: Bronze, Self-fertile. Very large fruit. Ripens early-mid season. Vigorous and disease resistant.

STRAWBERRIES **PRICE \$7.00 for 25**
\$25.00 for 100+

EARLIGLOW: Early-season. Medium berry. Excellent for fresh eating and freezing due to its sweet berries and uniform flavor. Recommended for beginners.

CAVENDISH: Excellent flavor, large attractive fruit, high yielding. Winter-hardy and disease resistant.

APPLE TREES **PRICE \$14.00 each**

(Trees are bare root.)

YELLOW DELICIOUS: Mid -to late-season apple, yellow-green to light yellow fruit color, extra juicy, crisp, and sweet! Used either fresh or for cooking. Self-pollinating.

STAYMAN WINESAP: Bright to deep red speckled skin. Yellow, firm, crisp flesh, tangy flavor. Good for dessert, canning or juice. Early bearer. Pollinate with Fuji. Red Delicious, Yellow Delicious or Gala.

HONEYCRISP: Fruit are sweet and mildly tart with beautiful red skin over a yellow background. Great apple for eating and ripens late September. Self-fertile.
